**Dromantine** is located five miles north of Newry and just off the Belfast /Dublin road, 45 minutes from Belfast I hour from Dublin airport. There are excellent rail and bus connections to Newry. **Directions from North :** About 5 miles after Loughbrickland Lake (on your left) you will see a small housing estate on your right—move to right lane of dual carriageway. Watch for the signpost for Dromantine and turn right into Derrycraw Road. Continue on the Derrycraw Road to the T-Junction at the end. The Main Gates of Dromantine will be directly opposite you.

**Directions from South :** When approaching Newry continue on the dual carriageway towards Belfast—**do not** take any of the exits signposted for Newry. After you pass a signpost saying Banbridge 10 miles, watch out for a large signpost for Dromantine. Turn left at Derrycraw Rd, where there is a small housing estate. Continue on the Derrycraw road to the T Junction—the Main Gates of Dromantine will be directly opposite you.

## Speakers :

**Prof David Horrell** - teaches modules on a wide range of New Testament topics in Exeter University, including New Testament ethics. Co-author of *The Bible and the Environment: Towards a Critical Ecological Biblical Theology* and *Greening Paul: Rereading the Apostle in an Age of Ecological Crisis*.

**Dr Alastair McIntosh** - Fellow of the Centre for Human Ecology, Glasgow, Honorary Fellow of the Schumacher Society and Visiting Professor of Human Ecology at the University of Strathclyde. His books include *Soil and Soul; Hell and High Water* and *Rekindling Community: Connecting People, Environment and Spirituality*.

**Rev Peter Owen-Jones** - Anglican clergyman, author and television presenter. His 2009 BBC documentary, *How to Live a Simple Life*, saw him turn his back on consumerism to follow in the footsteps of St Francis. His books include *Bed of Nails, Psalm* and *Letters from an Extreme Pilgrim: Reflections on Life, Love and the Soul*.

**Dr Anne Primavesi** - Fellow of the Centre for Interdisciplinary Study of Religion, Birkbeck College, University of London. A systematic theologian focusing on ecology, her books include *Cultivating Unity within the Biodiversity of God* and *Making God Laugh: Human Arrogance and Ecological Humility*.

**Prof Stephen Williams** - Professor of Systematic Theology at Union Theological College, Belfast. He has published in different areas in biblical studies, theology and intellectual history, including *The Limits of Hope and the Logic of Love and Revelation and Reconciliation: a Window on Modernity*.
