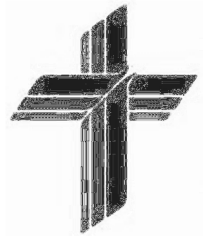

CHURCH SERVICES

- **SUNDAY**, the weekly commemoration of the Creation, the Resurrection, and the gift of the Holy Spirit, is the principal Holy Day. Saints' Day at this season are:
 - (1) The Feast of St. Thomas the Apostle (3rd July)
 - (2) The Feast of St. Mary Magdalene (22nd July)
 - (3) The Feast of St. James the Apostle (25th July)
 - (4) The Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord (6th August).

- Days of particular Irish Church commemoration:
 - (1) Moninne of Killeavy, Armagh Diocese, 519 – 6th July.
 - (2) Kilian, bishop and martyr, Kilmore Diocese, 698 – 8th July.
 - (3) Declan of Ardmore, bishop, Cloyne diocese, 5th century – 24th July.

- The HOLY EUCHARIST on Wednesday mornings is **NOT** celebrated during the month of July. (The re-start date is 2 August).
